TRADES COURSES TAKING OFF...

MAHI WHAKAMANA: SUPPORTING SUCCESS THROUGH INNOVATIVE LEARNING

Last year, three secondary schools in the Eastern Bay of Plenty launched pilot courses designed to support ākonga who weren't thriving in traditional classroom settings. This initiative, called Mahi Whakamana, is a collaboration between schools, local iwi, government organisations, and Futures Academy to provide school-specific courses through our trades academy.

Mahi Whakamana offers innovative learning approaches that help keep students engaged and motivated in their education, allowing them to achieve success and build stronger pathways to employment. The pilot courses were a huge success, and we're excited to share that all three schools are now officially offering these courses to students in their local communities.

The initiative focuses on hands-on, practical learning experiences, such as construction projects, where students gain valuable skills. This approach has led to increased student engagement, improved attendance, and higher achievement rates in NCEA. Many students have also secured apprenticeships and employment opportunities, with a focus on creating long-term career pathways in the trades. This is a fantastic step forward in ensuring that all students have the opportunity to thrive in an educational environment that suits their individual needs and goals.

With the continued success of Mahi Whakamana, it's clear that these courses are making a real difference, helping students gain skills that set them up for success in both education and future employment.

CREATIVE BUSINESS ACADEMY



A new and thought-provoking course is being trialled this year at Trident High School. Nine students from Eastern Bay of Plenty are delving into their own self journey, finding out how to make money doing what they love.

One of the key focuses is pulled from the Japanese Concept; Ikigai, which explores oneself to find a creative way to turn what you love into paid employment. This course guides students through their individual journey gaining NCEA credits along the way.

The Tutor, Jeff Lee, said that "he hopes to help students to start putting time into themselves to ultimately find ways to make work not feel like work at all".

Mitchell from Otumoetai College has made a strong impression on the ETCO recruitment team and secured a paid role as an ETCO-employed apprentice. Through this opportunity, Mitchell will receive full support from ETCO, including practical placements with a range of host companies. This will allow him to grow and develop in his trade while being mentored by industry professionals.

Yasmin, another standout student from our Trades
Academy at Te Kura, has also started her Level 4
apprenticeship training with Etco. We're excited to see
Yasmin embark on this next stage of her journey, gaining
valuable experience as she continues to hone her skills
in the trade sector.

After successfully completing the Farming & Agriculture, Level 2 trades course through Toi Ohomai, Sophie has secured a cadetship at Otiwhiti Station. The course tutor said that "Sophie exemplifies everything good about a young person wanting to create a successful career in the agriculture industry. I'm incredibly proud of what she has achieved so far and excited to see what the future holds for her".
